

LINEAGE WORKSHEET

Use the fields below to track each generation in your lineage beginning with you and ending with your chosen ancestor (including each male and female ancestors in your bloodline lineage). The first three generations require government issued vital records for birth, marriage, and death. If these records are available for the fourth generation, then they should be ordered. Remaining generations require proof of birth, marriage, and death. For each generation, identify the document that connects to the next generation (e.g., BC shows parents' names). For Gen #2+, list the male ancestor first, followed by his wife. Capitalize the name of the person who is the child of the next generation. For simplicity, use the following abbreviations:
BC = Birth Certificate; **DC** = Death Certificate; **MR** = Marriage Record.
